

## **REFUND POLICY FOR 2021-23 BATCHES OF PGPBM & PGPM-HR**

### ***Withdrawal on or before the Registration Date***

The Candidates, who have accepted the Offer of Admission, can withdraw the admission from the offered Programme of IIM Tiruchirappalli on or before the registration date. Such candidates will be refunded entire amount paid by them after deducting Rs. 1,000/- as processing fee, if they withdraw on or before the given registration date.

### ***Withdrawal of Waitlist Commitment Amount***

Waitlist commitment amount paid by the candidates will be refunded in full at any point of time.

### ***Withdrawal after the Registration Date and / or after closure of Admissions Process***

No refund would be made where the student enrolment goes below the approved number of seats offered in PGPM and/or in PGPM-HR for 2021-23 batches, after the Registration and / or after closure of the admission process.

However, if the vacant seats that are created by the withdrawal of admissions can be filled up after the registration but before the closure of the admissions process and this way, if the withdrawal does not bring down the enrolment of the students below the approved numbers of seats (separately for PGPM and PGPM-HR Programmes), the refund will be processed for 2021-23 batches of PGPM & PGPM-HR as under;

- a. If a student withdraws within a month from the date of Registration, the amount will be refunded after deducting one month's (30 days) tuition fee, which will be calculated taking into account of 12 months' (365 days) tuition fee (Annual Fee/365 days X 30 days).
- b. If a student withdraws after 30 days from the date of Registration, the amount will be refunded after proportionate deduction.
- c. If multiple requests for withdrawal are received and the number of seats go below the approved intake of the respective programme (PGPM & PGPM-HR), a first-come-first served basis would be considered for the refund. In that case, the refund will be calculated differently for different students depending upon his/her sequence on first-come-first served basis.
